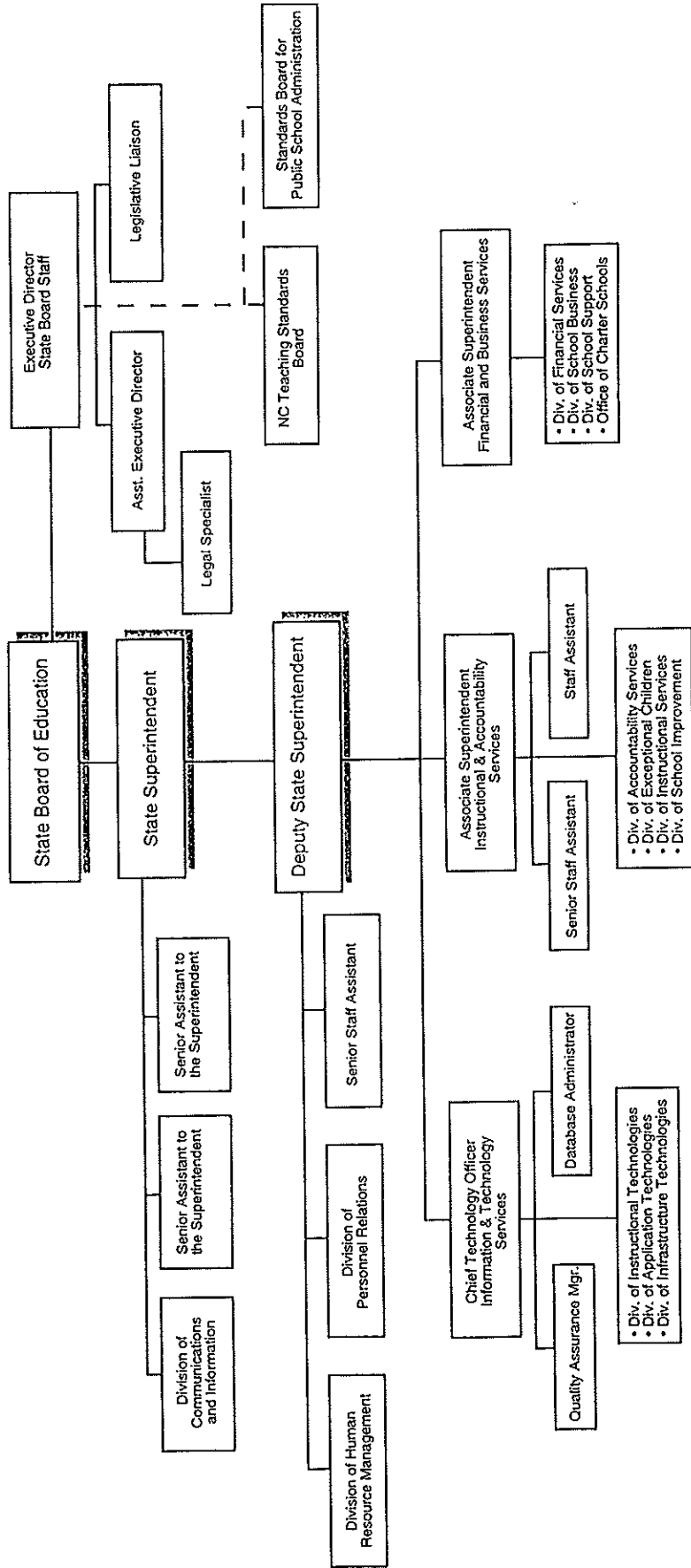
Proposed Organization

Dear Halifax Educators,

As you are aware, Superior Court Judge Howard Manning has focused attention on the student performance in Halifax County and directed the State Board of Education and the NC Department of Public Instruction to work with Halifax County Schools to improve student learning and achievement.

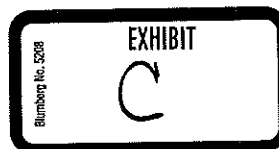
On Wednesday, the NC Department of Public Instruction presented the plan to Judge Manning to intensify its work with Halifax County Schools. The plan focuses on a more intense, day-to-day partnership between state leaders and Halifax leaders, beginning with professional development for teachers, principals and central office staff this summer. The administrator training is three weeks beginning July 27, and the teacher training is two weeks beginning August 3.

Other features of the plan include:

- three years of training and coaching for teachers, principals and central office staff;
- training for teacher assistants;
- hiring 12 instructional coaches (4 elementary, 4 middle school, 4 high school);
- master Board training for the Halifax County Board of Education;
- aggressive recruitment for vacant positions; and
- monitoring to ensure staff fulfills responsibilities.

We recognize that this level of partnership is new in our state, and signals a new way of doing business in Halifax County. We would like to emphasize that this work is a partnership. We know that we will need to make changes to improve student learning, but it is not our goal to create unnecessary upheaval for teachers, principals and other staff. It is our goal to work together to improve the performance of all on behalf of students. Our success will be measured in how well students learn and achieve.

Your participation and willingness to learn and change is essential to our success together. We all have much work to do and much to learn on behalf of students. We hope you will see this summer's professional development and the ongoing instructional support as opportunities for you to grow professionally. We are excited about the possibilities for increasing the long-term capacity of Halifax County's educators and schools.

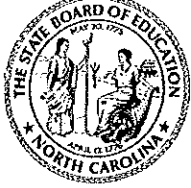

Re: Delays Approved at April SBE Meeting

Yesterday, the State Board of Education approved two important delays in policy implementation that will affect your school districts.

- **Graduation Project**
Board members approved a one-year delay to the North Carolina Graduation Project requirement for high school students. This action means that the Graduation Project will become a high school graduation requirement for the first time with students who first entered ninth grade in 2007-08 (Class of 2010-11).

For most school districts, schools and students have already begun their work on the Graduation Project in anticipation of the new requirement. I encourage that work to continue for two reasons. The Graduation Project is North Carolina's most real-world assessment and closely mirrors activities that graduates should be able to do in order to succeed in higher education or in the workplace. Second, to continue the Project at this point honors the student, teacher and mentor work that has already been done and lays the groundwork for the future when the Project will be a requirement for high school graduation. Many of your schools had been doing these projects for a number of years.

I have heard from some of you and others in your communities about some of the details of the Project requirements. This delay will give us time to more clearly identify Project areas where there could be more flexibility in implementation.

- **Graduate Pay Policy**
In December, the State Board of Education approved "Policies related to experience/degree credit for salary purposes," Policy ID Number TCP-A-006. This policy would recognize all graduate degrees earned through regionally accredited institutions for salary purposes and was to go into effect July 1, 2009. Yesterday, the Board agreed to delay this effective date until July 1, 2010. This decision is in recognition of the financial situation of the state at this time.

Thank you for sharing this information with all pertinent staff in your districts. We are in the process of adjusting Board policies and our online information in these areas accordingly.

1. Board Review Meetings. The Superintendent with Betsy West will facilitate the preparation of Board materials as well as the post Board briefing held on the Friday morning after the Board Meeting. The Superintendent and CEO will participate.
2. PMC. The Superintendent and Annette Murphy will facilitate the work of the Portfolio Management Council. The Council will meet monthly on the third Monday of the month. The Superintendent and CEO will participate.
3. The CEO will be the lead communicator with local superintendents. Vanessa will continue to do the updates as the communications director.
4. The Superintendent will continue to make appointments to committees and commissions.
5. Contracts will be signed by the superintendent after approval of Phillip Price and the CEO.
- 6 & 7. The Superintendent and CEO will approve all documents sent to the US Department of Education. The Superintendent and CEO will share to be the lead communicator role with the Department with all communications being reviewed by the CEO.
8. The Superintendent and CEO will co-chair strategic roundtables for statewide assistance to LEAs and schools.
9. The CEO/Chairman will be the spokesperson for DPI and the SBE. The Superintendent may also serve as a spokesperson on issues and events after consulting with the CEO. The Superintendent will represent the Public Schools of North Carolina at events held across the state.
10. The Superintendent will be a member and co-chair, when appropriate, committees and groups making policy recommendations.
11. The Superintendent will interact with other agencies as deemed appropriate by the CEO. The CEO will be the contact at the executive level.

18. The Superintendent will receive and respond to complaints and concerns coming from the public addressed to the Superintendent. Other complaints will be addressed by the CEO or the appropriate leader within a department.
19. The Superintendent will convene and chair a Task Force on Career and Technical Education as directed by the Governor.
